Use TodaysMeet to promote backchanneling, summarizing and other types of critical discussions all in 140 characters or less.

Encourage real-time student participation in class with tools such as Poll Everywhere and Socrative.

Find a good dictionary app for your subject area and encourage students to use it.

8

Have students publish their ideas using Padlet.

9

Use Google Forms to administer assessments, surveys and exit tickets.

10

Utilize Google Drive (app) for note-taking.

11

Have students record observations, take photos and document their learning on a field trip via their cell phones. They can then share those encounters via a presentation, on SchoolFusion or with a more advanced platform such as Edmodo.

12

Have students use their cell phones to capture their everyday interactions with the content they are learning. Students can then share those encounters on SchoolFusion or with a more advanced platform such as Edmodo.
